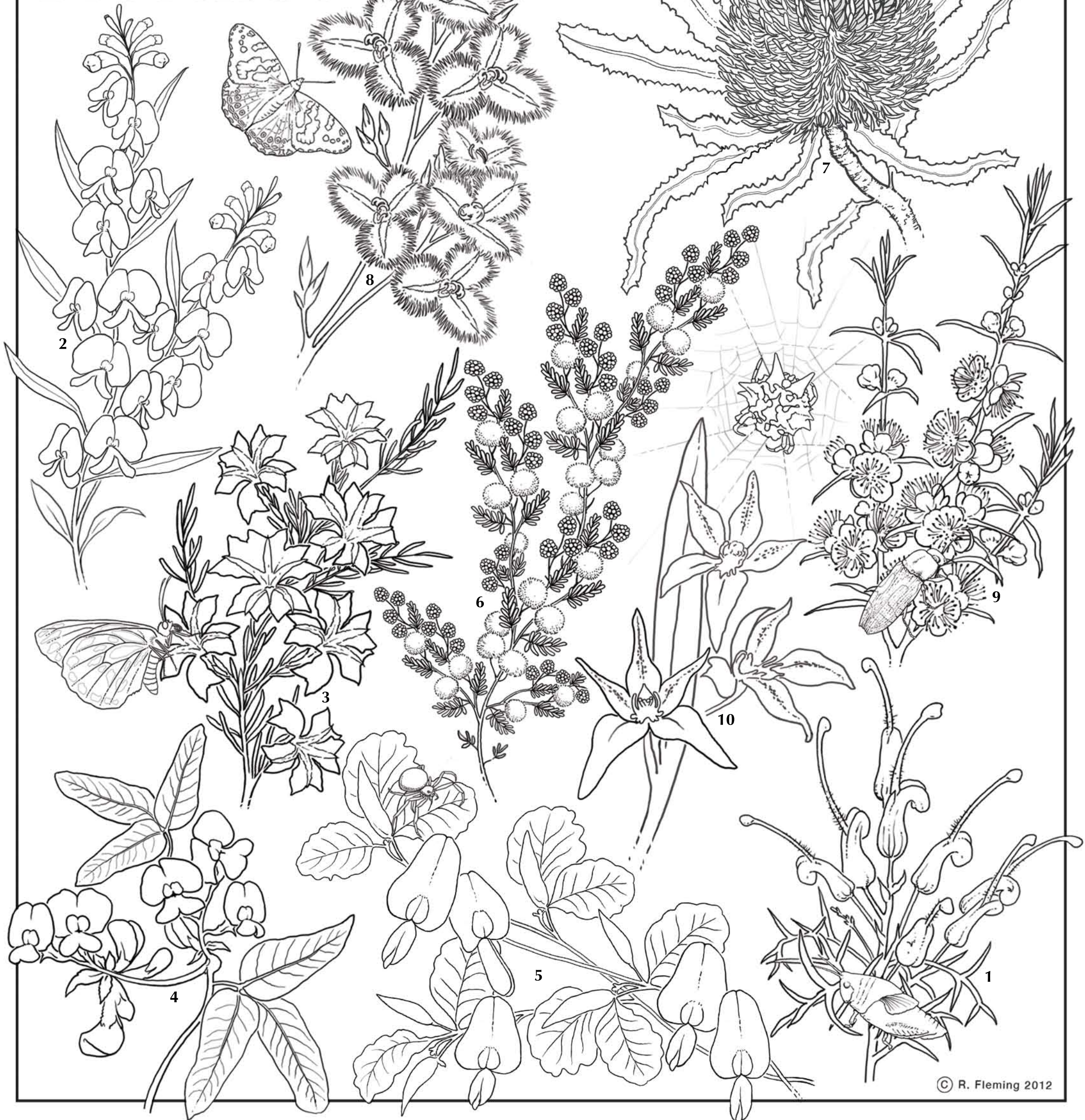


WILDFLOWERS OF THE ARMADALE DISTRICT

Many flowering plants grow naturally in the bushland of the Armadale district. On the floor of the Jarrah forest, small shrubs include the bright red Wilson's Grevillea *Grevillea wilsonii* (1), the purple Common Hovea *Hovea trisperma* (2), the delicate Blue Lechenaultia *Lechenaultia biloba* (3) and the twining Coral Vine *Kennedia coccinea* (4). Amongst the Wandoo along the Darling Scarp can be found the red-flowered Running Postman *Kennedia prostrata* (5) and the bright yellow Gravel Wattle *Acacia lateriticola* (6) making a spectacular show in spring time. On the Swan Coastal Plain, the Flame Banksia *Banksia menziesii* (7) displays its large pink and orange flower cones from February through to August. In bush areas can be seen the purple Fringed Lily *Thysanotus multiflorus* (8), the pink Swan River Myrtle *Hypocalymma robustum* (9) and the yellow Cowslip Orchid *Caladenia flava* (10) with its red markings.
