## **REPORTS**

Friday 27<sup>th</sup> October "Lord Howe Island" Eddy Wajon

Eddy started by giving some general information about this small island, which lies in the Tasman Sea, 600km east of Port Macquarie. It was formed by vulcanicity, but all that is left above water is a small crescent-shaped island. Because it is so isolated, with a very short

airstrip, flights can be cancelled with no notice in the event of inclement weather – as happened when he visited.

There are very few permanent residents, who cater mainly for the 400 tourists a week who are allowed in. There are marine activities such as scuba diving and plenty of walks on land.



The vegetation is mostly scrub, with some forest in sheltered places. The species are, as would be expected, related to those in NSW and southern QLD, being carried there originally by wind or birds. Eddy showed photos of many, explaining where he had seen their relatives on the mainland. He also talked about fauna, with some stunning bird photos – a Sooty Tern was especially notable.

There were many questions afterwards, and Eddy and Donna were still chatting on into supper time! Thank you for a very interesting 'virtual visit'.

#### SEED COLLECTING TIME

Summer is all too rapidly approaching, so if we want to collect seed, either for ourselves or for the seed bank, we need to check our plants frequently. Peas, in particular, may be ripening early, due to these very warm spells that we keep having, so it may be necessary to cover them with an old stocking or similar to prevent them being released when we are not hovering over them. Grevilleas will also release their seed when ripe.

If the seed pods are starting to turn brown, or the stem behind the pod has dried out, then they can be collected.
